

What is it?

The Spellebrity Video Contest is an opportunity for students to spell out the unique ways that they can kindle the love of reading. It's also a way for your student to win an expenses-paid trip to the 2017 Scripps National Spelling Bee near Washington, D.C., from May 28 - June 2.

Why?

We believe that when you kindle the love of reading, great spelling and vocabulary will follow!

Who?

Students who have not passed beyond the eighth grade and who are legal residents of the United States and its territories are invited to create a video for the contest. Videos may be submitted by teams of up to four people or by an individual student. Previous Spellebrity Video Contest Finalists are not eligible.

How does it work?

We want you to spell out how you can kindle the love of reading and feature three words that would be useful to know in a spelling bee — words you have learned through your reading. Students brainstorm, film and edit a video of up to five minutes in length that captures this idea. We're looking for fun, narrative videos that provide a unique take on the prompt, "How can you kindle the love of reading?"

A teacher or parent can then visit **spellebrity.com** to enter the video by completing an online entry form, submitting permission forms with signed parental consent for each student and, of course, uploading the video itself!

Each member of the Semifinalist teams (10) will receive:

• a Kindle Paperwhite.

Each member of the Finalist teams (5) will receive:

- an expenses-paid trip to the 2017 Scripps National Spelling Bee, including
 - economy-class roundtrip airfare or train fare for each team member and a parent/ guardian,
 - one standard hotel room at the Gaylord National Resort and Convention Center,
 - a \$400 gift card to defray travel and meal expenses, and
 - complimentary tickets for each team member and a parent/guardian for the Memorial Day Barbecue, a Bee-organized tour of Washington, D.C., and the Awards Banquet.

Each member of the Champion team (1) will receive:

- a \$1,000 cash award, and
- a trophy.

A panel of judges will determine the Semifinalist videos.

March 1, 2017

10 Semifinalist videos are announced, and public voting takes place at spellebrity.com.

March 31, 201

5 Finalist videos are announced and displayed at **spellebrity.com**.

May 28 - 31, 2017

5 Finalist videos are presented during Bee Week, and Scripps National Spelling Bee participants vote for their favorite videos.

June 1, 2017

The video that receives the most votes will be announced prior to the 2017 Scripps National Spelling Bee Finals.
